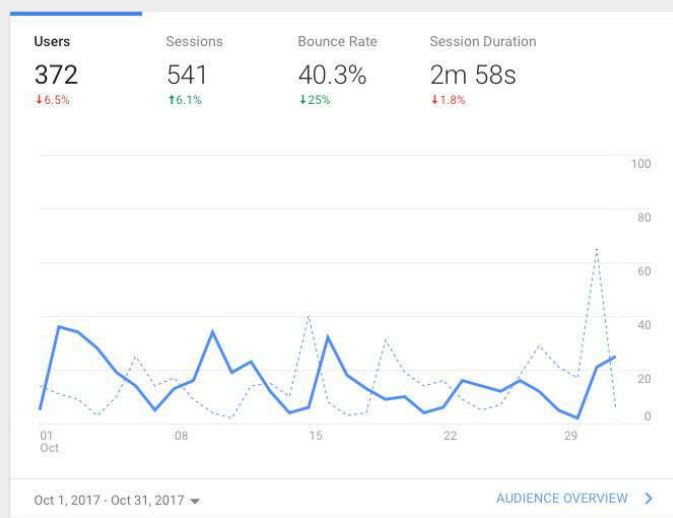

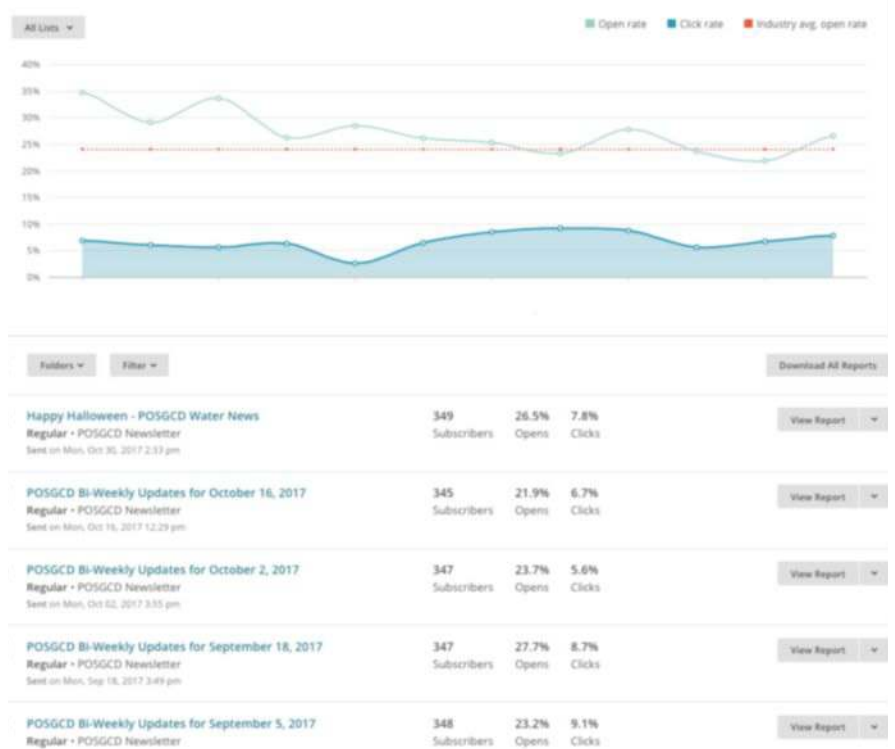

# Educational Outreach

## Rainwater Harvesting
