Dear Sir or Madam,

The Post Oak Savannah Groundwater Conservation District (POSGCD) is a political subdivision established in 2001 by the 77th Legislature under HB 1784 to conserve and protect water, protect groundwater users, protect and recharge groundwater, prevent pollution or waste of groundwater, and regulate the transport of water outside the boundaries of the district amongst other responsibilities. The district receives all of its revenue from fees imposed on municipal/commercial pumpers and transporters of groundwater; therefore, all sources of funds are considered local funds.

To expand the POSGCD educational portfolio, the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service Texas Water Resources Institute (TWRI) is being requested to assist the district in coordinating and delivering science-based education curriculum as well as assist in conducting public relations and outreach activities. For this work, POSGCD will grant TWRI a total of \$33,745. Due to the nature of our funds, POSGCD can only reimburse indirect costs at 10% of total direct costs.

We are looking forward to working with TWRI as we expand our educational efforts.
