"Before computers, I was a crane operator in the US Army and operated a 300 foot crane stationed with the 82nd Airborne division at Fort Bragg North Carolina. I would end up with over 2500 hours on the crane. All documented. This was back when all we had were typewriters.

After the Army, 6 years, I confounded Hgh-Tech laboratories in Blue Springs, MO. We manufactured hearing aids for over 400 Beltone hearing aid centers across the United States. I was all self taught on hearing aids and received FDA certification on 3 different hearing aid models. I know... I hated working on heavy equipment and found out I loved using my brain for computers. I designed the first hearing aids on my first iMac in 1984.

From that, I created one of the first accounting software packages for the Mac and got a 4 1/2 star rating for it from MacWorld magazine. After selling that retail for several years, I went to work with the Houston medical center and created an account system for them that was used by 30 simultaneous users throughout the hospital.

Unfortunately, Quicken came along and I could not compete with their advertising. The rest is history. :)

I also worked as an SME for Procter & Gamble, worked with Marketing Resources of America and many others. Sometimes more than one company at a time. Now I love what I do here in Sunny Southwest Florida.
